Pastor's Corner of Light: Faith is More Than Belief

Last week I opened my Corner with the story of Jesus healing the ten lepers (Luke 17:11-19). In that event Jesus clearly showed His love and compassion even for the social rejects of that time/place. If you also remember, Jesus healed the Canaanite (Gentile) woman's daughter (Matt 15:22) and the Centurion's daughter (probably Gentile) (Matt 5:5ff). Jesus is very sincere when He commands us to love one another which includes the broken and poor (spiritual & financial) and even our enemies.

Of course, the first step in being able to live this kind of life will have to start with our loving the Lord our God, with all of our heart, all of our soul, and all of our mind (**Matt 22:37**) From that love should spring a well of gratitude and thanks. Christ was actually surprised that only ONE leper came back to Him to offer his thanks.

How are we doing with our expressed appreciation for the blessings in our life?

1 Thess 5:18; Eph 5:20; Phil 4:6 all share the sentiment that we are to *continually* be giving praise and thanks. **Heb 13:15** "Through Him then, let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, a fruit of lips that give thanks to His Name." And is it any surprise, the next verse after commanding us to praise and give thanks says "And do not neglect doing good and sharing -- for with such sacrifices God is pleased."

Faith and love influence how we live our lives. Love and gratitude impact our attitude. The lepers were told to go present themselves to the priest. Why were they told that? They had not been cured at that moment of time - yet they still *turned and walked forward*. Faith and hope must have guided them to do as Jesus said. And the result of their faith was healing.

We are told to love God with our hearts, souls and minds. If these aspects of our lives can be focused and given to God then they can also be affected by God. Has your heart been filled with the Spirit and filled with love, compassion and with forgiveness for others. Has your soul been blessed with a cleansing and filled with God's love? Has your mind been given over to devotion, study and a commitment to live for God? I pray that your life reflects appreciation and wonder at the way God's love works in your life.

May **2 Tim 1:7** fill your life: "for God has not given us a spirit of timidity, but of power and love and discipline."

Somehow, some way, your little kingdom will look very attractive to you today, but it is the very kingdom from which grace works unrelentingly to rescue you.

The Bible really is a story of kingdoms in conflict, and that battle rages on the field of your heart. It rages for control of your soul. The two kingdoms in conflict cannot live in peace with one another. There will never be a truce. There is no safe demilitarized zone where you can live. Each kingdom demands your loyalty and your worship. Each kingdom promises you life. One kingdom leads you to the King of kings and the other sets you up as king. The big kingdom works to dethrone you and decimate your little kingdom of one, while the little kingdom seduces you with promises it cannot deliver. The big kingdom of glory and grace is gorgeous from every perspective, but it doesn't always looks that way to you. The little kingdom is deceptive and dark, bur at points it appears to you as beautiful and life giving. You either pray that God's kingdom will come and that his will be done or you work to make sure that your will and your way win the day.

So it makes sense that Jesus came to earth as a King to establish his kingdom. Like a hero Monarch, he died so his kingdom would last eternally. But he did not come as an earthly king to set up a physical, political kingdom. He came to set up a much better, much greater, much more expansive kingdom than one that locates itself in a certain place and time. He came to dethrone all other rule and set up his grace-infused, life-giving reign in your heart. He came to free you and me from our bondage to our own self-serving kingdom purposes. He came to help us understand that his grace is not given to make our little kingdom purposes work but to invite us to a much, much better kingdom.

So tell yourself again today that there is a King but he is not you. Tell yourself that there is a kingdom that will protect and satisfy your heart but it is not yours. As Jesus said, there is a kingdom that you should seek, but you will never, ever be its monarch. Quite apart from anything you could have done, achieved, earned, or deserved, you have been given a kingdom. The price of that gift was the suffering and death of the King. But he conquered death so that by grace he could establish his rule in your heart. Right now he reigns on your behalf (see 1 Corinthians 15), and he will continue to do so until the last enemy of your soul and of his kingdom has been defeated. Then he will invite you into the final kingdom, where peace and righteousness will reign forever and ever. This is the story of your faith. The story of this Savior King is now your biography. Why would you ever want to go back to the delusional hopes of your kingdom of one?
