PASTOR'S CORNER - Self-Control: How Necessary Is It?

Self-control relates to the passions (anger/love), the appetites (food/sex, etc.), and the will (impulsive decisions). The lack of self-control is a mark of a fool. **Proverbs 25:28** "A man without self-control is like a city broken into and left without walls": thus no means of defense against one's enemies.

The walls which we should be resurrecting to protect us is that of the Holy Spirit. We should be incorporating and building the Spirit within us. The Spirit fights against sin not merely in defense but also in attack by producing in Christians the positive attributes of godly character. Self-control is the discipline given by the Holy Spirit that allows Christians to resist the power of the flesh (cf. Gal. 5:17). Again, Christ and the Spirit (Gal. 5:25) come together as the source of the believer's life. Christians have crucified the flesh, or died with Christ to sin (see Gal. 6:14; Rom. 6:4–6). Now that the old order of things has passed away for believers, their old sinful selves have crumbled as well.

1 Peter 4:7 "The end of all things is at hand; therefore be self-controlled and soberminded for the sake of your prayers "The end of all things is at hand" does not mean Peter was expecting Christ's immediate return. It means that all the major events in God's great salvation plan (the death, resurrection, and ascension of Christ and the outpouring of the Spirit at Pentecost) had already occurred. Therefore, Christ's return could happen at any time. But the imminent arrival of the end is a call for believers to be self-controlled and sober-minded, so that they may be devoted to prayer and maximize their usefulness in God's kingdom. In Mark 9:43-48 Jesus speaks of removing body parts to show the seriousness of sin and the fact that nothing can be more important than God. Jesus does not mean that people should literally remove body parts, for the literal removal of them cannot remove the root of sin in the heart (Mk 7:20-23; Mk 9:45). Jesus' words serve as a sober warning concerning the severity of sin, which can lead to hell and a fire that is not quenched (Mark 8:35-37; Mark 9:47-48). That is why it is so important that we have a knowledge of God's Word and a willingness to obey.

So, as we go about our days and living our lives let us always ensure that we are disciplining ourselves in such a fashion that we know and are living according to God's will. Such discipline will cause us to focus on the things above (Col 3:1) and to lean upon the understanding of our Lord (Prov 3:5,6,7). Placing His Word in our hearts (Ps. 119:11; Jer 31:33) will give us the teaching and training required to equip us for every good work. The more we study and understand the more our lives will be in sync with the Lord and His blessings will be imparted to us for that 'abundant life' He promised us.
