

I held the baby against my chest as my rocker arced to and fro, but he continued to cry – not a whimper but a red-faced, real-tears, all-out wail. This little one was comfortable with me. I mentored his mama. I'd been in his life since his beginning. But he wasn't feeling well.

Mama would be back soon, but every moment was one moment too long. I stood. Moved him to my shoulder. Swayed. No help for this little mister. Until Mama returned. Once he was in her arms, the crying ceased. He rested, tiny face pressed into the curve of her. His fists unclenched. Cheeks stained red returned to pink. Her presence brought peace.

It reminded me of the time in God's word when two sisters waited for the peace of Jesus's presence when their brother, Lazarus, was ill. But Jess didn't arrive until Lazarus was in the grave.

Martha met him with anguish. "Jesus," she said, "if You'd been here, he wouldn't have died."

The sisters had longed for a healing. But Jesus called Lazarus from the grave, and they received a resurrection. The presence of Jesus is like that – always more powerful than we can imagine. It changes circumstance and soul.

I often succumb to worry over my loved ones or over a tough circumstance I can't see the end of. My soul cries like a babe needing comfort. When I'm so disturbed that I'm distraught, I can be sure that I've not practiced being the presence of Jesus.

He brings hope. He works in ways I cannot fathom. Trusting the presence of Jesus is training myself to receive peace.

With the little one lost in sweet slumber, his mama and I sat and visited. The rocker creaked as soft and gentle as our words.

Presence changes everything.
