Pastors Corner of Light: I Have Learned to be Content

If you read 1 Phil 4:6-13 you will get the full gist of Paul's comment. His final words in this passage are: "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me." I am certain God is strengthening Paul and brings Paul into a successful and fulfilled life because he is in tune with God's will/wishes. Sometimes our struggle with God is not because He is unfaithful to us but because our values, plans and expectations do not match His. When we read through the bible we realize that God's primary agenda is not that we would achieve a comfortable and pleasurable life but be contented and at peace.

Think about what makes you frustrated or sad. Think about what makes you satisfied and happy? What causes these feelings? How many our joys and sorrows have anything to do with the kingdom and purposes of God? How often do you mourn about your lack of conformity to His will? How often do you celebrate the outpouring of daily grace? How often are you grieved because your heart still wanders? How often are you grateful that God meets you every day with rescuing and restraining mercies? Many of us don't need a disaster to feel frustration and disappointment; no, a flat tire on the way to work can seem to wreck our whole day.

We can only experience Paul's "contentment" – the kind that does not rise or fall based on our circumstances – when what we want most for ourselves matches what God wants for us. When what we want is not the thing that God wants most for us, then we are living at cross-purposes with Him and this causes us to struggle to see Him as kind, good, faithful, and loving. And when we begin to question the goodness of God, we stop going to Him for help and instead we seek help only from those in this world who are immediately available. Why are we failing to see God and to hear His words? It is not because He has forsaken us. It is not because He is silent. It is because while we are worrying about why our lives have been so hard, God is working on something much more significant and glorious than the comforts of the moment. With wisdom, faithfulness, and rescuing grace, He is securing our eternal rescue. And that is a reason to continually celebrate!

We will never get the freedom and long-term satisfaction we thought self-rule would bring. Ignoring God is never a pathway to blessing.

There are two lies that tempt each of us somehow, some way. They are the lies that fueled the disastrous choice of Adam and Eve in that moment of temptation in the garden. Yes, it is true, these lies have as much power today as they did then. The first is the lie of autonomy. This lie says that you are an independent human being with the right to live as you wish. Now, if you're a parent, you know that our children fall into embracing that lie. That's why they don't hunger for more of your corection and don't esteem your authority. From day one, our children want to believe that their lives belong to them and that they are the only authority that they need. But we don't belong to ourselves. If God created us – and he did – then we belong to him. I am a painter by avocation, and when I finish a painting, it belongs to me precisely because I made it. The painting is not autonomous. In the same way, human autonomy is a lie.

The second lie is the lie of self-sufficiency, which tells me that I have everything I need within myself to be what I was created to be and to do what I was designed to do. The fact is that God is the only self-sufficient being in the universe. We were created for dependency, first on God and then on one another in loving community. We need to be taught, encouraged, warned, strengthened, forgiven, healed, restored, counseled, loved, rebuked, and delivered – all things we cannot provide for ouselves. Human self-sufficiency is a lie.

So Jesus calls us to reject the lie and come to him. Under his yoke is the ony place where true freedom can be found. He says: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matt. 11:28-30). There is freedom to be found, but not in empty promises of autonomy and self-sufficiency. True freedom is only ever found when grace ties your heart to Christ. Freed from trying to be what you can't be and to do what you were not designed to do, you are now free to carry the light burdens of forgiveness-giving and life-restoring grace.
