PASTOR'S CORNER - Growing and Recharging part 4

Last week I wrote an article regarding our mentorship under our Lord, Jesus Christ. Today I want to share part of an article written by Brian White for "Action Magazine": In our lives we often find ourselves isolated on an island surrounded by the world. The pressure to succeed or fit in leads us to compartmentalize – an approach whereby we adopt different personas for different areas of our life. We try to be faithful and 'spiritual' in our church settings and resort to keeping our faith to ourselves in worldly settings. Consequently, we are on our own to fight-the-fight against temptation of 'conforming' to succeed/ be accepted. (Rom 12:2) Living such a life doesn't work. It's discouraging and saps the JOY that Jesus offers in His promise of 'an abundant life'. (John 10:10) So where do we turn to live a faith-integrated life?

When Jesus chose His apostles, He didn't operate under a pattern of twice-a-week bible studies; He didn't just lecture them with truth and then send them on their way to figure out for themselves how to apply it to their individual lives. He walked 'alongside' them – everyday, in the marketplace, at meals and everyday events. He mentored them and counseled them through daily situations to wisely apply spiritual principles in teachable moments. When you read the last part of Acts 2 you see how newly converted Christians handled their new found faith – they fellowshipped with one another. When operating out in the world we need to have a strong foundation of faith and a proven spiritual support system of mentors we lean into who understands us well enough to exhort, train, and develop us. I am reminded of Prov 27:17 "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." And "Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly, as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom..." Col 3:16

The apostles had a teacher and mentor in Jesus; early Christians had the apostles; in a similar fashion we need to seek out experienced spiritually mature mentors who can offer seasoned counsel to guide us through trying times. We need to connect with trusted spiritual leaders/advisors who will exhort us in the spiritual disciplines as we integrate our faith at home, among our church family, and in the work place – thus helping us thrive as God intended.

Finally, not only should we seek out mentors to help us, but we should be concerned for the interests of others – striving to be a mentor and encourager ourselves. Our own failures can be a valuable experience when what we have learned is shared with others. When you are able to help others, you will also experience personal growth as well.

LIVING IN THE LAND OF PROMISE

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and with all your strength." Deuteronomy 6:4-5 NIV

In answering a question about what the most important command was, Jesus didn't hesitate or say something about how they all were important. He identified what Moses said in Deuteronomy 6:4-5 as "the most import one." (Mark 12:29)

This command serves the same purpose for us as it did for Israel. It pushes us away from our idols of self, status, comfort, wealth, entertainment, and whatever else we might be tempted by. It reminds us that life is in God and nothing else. Our God is not a niche god who controls only a small sector of individualism, media, science and technology, etc. As Paul says to those at Athens whose lives were dominated by the regional gods of idolatry, Yahweh is the One in whom "we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28). He isn't part of the picture, He is the picture!

When you have a relationship with this God in all is immensity, it allows you, like Israel, to lie in the land of promise. If your God is something less, you're probably still knocking around in the wilderness.

Where are you living these days?

Father, we wish to bring You honor by living lives unified in the our passion and purpose for You. Lift us above our earthly entanglements so we might live closer daily to You. In Christ, we pray. Amen
