What truth are You filling my mind, eyes, and heart with? What untruths have I been believing? Where are You longing to replace these lies with the reality of Your unconditional love? Lead me to Your truth, which is everlasting and freeing, indeed.

Pastor's Corner of Light: Jesus Models Our Proper Response to Various Trials

God allows His children to go through trials and tribulations. He uses these tests to strengthen our faith and help us see better our relationship with Him. Consider the trial the "Only Begotten Son' went through. Jesus' suffering consisted of not only the betrayal and abandonment of His closest followers but the shame and the agony of scourging and crucifixion. On top of this was His knowledge that 'soon' His Father was going to be forced to turn His back on Him as He took on the sins of the world. To think of how He took this upon Himself for us should bring not only gratitude but the desire to worship Him for His loving sacrifice.

What was Jesus' response to this upcoming suffering? He retreated to His Father like a ship seeking safe harbor in a raging storm! Jesus models what it looks like to fall into the presence of God – hurting but hopeful. He approached the Father in weakness yet displays perfect strength. Mark's gospel (14:33,34) describes Jesus 'as deeply distressed and troubles' and 'overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death.' Some view emotional suffering as sinful, but we know it's not, because Jesus – the sinless sacrifice – experienced it. Jesus cried out in faith, entrusting His pain to the Father. When we bring our anguish to God, we please Him. Jesus, in the Garden, teaches us how emotions, when acknowledged and submitted to God, can deepen intimacy with the Father. It is in these darkest moments that Jesus demonstrates perfect surrender to the only One who can help us through our struggles.

During these moments we must slow down to acknowledge the weight we are carrying. We need to make space to bring our fears and/or pain to the Lord. Even a simple breath prayer can help at times. Longer moments of prayer need to be set aside, not as an obligation to live up to, but because we know we have One who is always seeking to help us and guide us. We need to be able to pray boldly and surrender our will boldly so that the Father can bring us rest and peace. Mtt 11:28-30 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." May you find the peace and contentment that the Lord's desires us to have!

I know the same is true for me. The faithful God who brought me to this place will accompany back home. And I can't wait to see what He has in store for me there.

Jesus, thank You for the cross and the empty tomb. And thank You that my relationship with You will continue for eternity.
