Pastor's Corner of Light: "To Church or Not To Church"

In "Christianity Today" there was an article by Adam Carrington, "People Perish for Lack of Religion" where he notes that a new study emphasizes that a loss of religion has led to a rise of physical or mental suffering resulting in more deaths from despair in the form of induced overdose, other forms of suicide and health issues from alcoholism. He reflects on two ways in which people suffer when they are separated from church. "First, without church, we lack full communion with God; second, without church, we lack full knowledge of God" and I would add a third – we lack social support without our Christian family

Responding to this tragic rise in deaths can feel like this is an overwhelming, insurmountable task. The truth is that the church community has a tremendous amount to offer to those who are crying out for help. This is done by meeting physical needs, serving sacrificially, and building relationships that create the trust needed for spiritual conversations – in this way the church can help people find hope and peace!

In our latest trends we have begun to live as if our religion is just that — "our" religion and thus community is something we can take or leave. But the truth is, when we look at the beginning of creation we see very clearly that created humans are meant to be social by nature "It is not good for the man to be alone." (Gen 2:18) What was good for Adam was a community for which Eve was the first manifestation. The breakdowns and internal struggles of our marriages are symptomatic of a situation which lacks sufficient or healthy mutual participation. Removal from participation in the body of Christ starves the soul, denying it the spiritual food that it desperately needs.

Mtt 18:20 "For where 2 or 3 have gathered together in My name, I am there in their midst." To separate yourself from church is to miss an opportunity to be with Christ. To separate yourself from church is to miss an opportunity to receive God's love from His family and to miss an opportunity to fulfill one of the great commandments: love your neighbor. Missing church denies us the opportunity to encourage and be encouraged; to disciple and be discipled. In the same way that iron sharpens iron – we miss the opportunity to help one another to walk the straight and narrow path. Just like a seed needs sun, water and soil – so we too need the learning, wisdom, example and encouragement of our brothers/sisters. Acts 2:46 illustrates this "Day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart". And consider this: a person who is seeking a stable, enriched life could not do any better than involving themselves in a community whose sole desire is to look after one another and stimulate one another into actions of love and good deeds. This is the mantra, if you would, of the Church (Heb 10:24). Be an active family member!!!

Oh, sing to the Lord a new song! I sort of like the old tunes that bring soft memories to mind and that soothe my soul with the sounds of days gone by. But those new songs have rhythm and a beat that the kids of today are moving to, and I must confess, they are very catchy. God, I pray to stay in touch and in tune with where your Spirit is luring me, and all of us, to go. My fear of tomorrow I relinquish to your love of me today.

Wise People Choose Mercy

Proverbs 17:9 (TLB)

The Bible says wisdom "is full of mercy and the fruit of good deeds" (James 3:17 NLT). In other words—even when people mess up, sin, fumble, and fail—it's wise to show grace.

God is both the wisest and most merciful being in the universe. Everything you have in life—even your next breath—is a gift from him. If we got what we deserved, we wouldn't be alive. Yet God gives us exactly what we need, not what we deserve. He's full of mercy.

In the same way, wise people give others what they need, not what they deserve. Wise people don't emphasize other's mistakes; instead, wise people are merciful. They cut people slack—because they know God cuts them slack all the time.

When you judge, you're being foolish. But when you're merciful, you're reflecting God.

Proverbs 17:9 says, "Love forgets mistakes; nagging about them parts the best of friends" (TLB).

I saw a beautiful example of this in Mike, a man who had been on the Saddleback facilities staff for many years. I ran into him on the day he and his wife, Sally, celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. Sally was getting ready to drive off, so I walked over to her car to congratulate her. I asked her, "What is the secret of a 50-year marriage?" She looked at me and said, "Pastor, I never tried to change him."

After she drove off, I walked over to Mike and said, "Mike, what's the secret to 50 years of marriage?" He said, "I never tried to change her."

Through 50 years of marriage, Sally and Mike surely had seen each other fumble and fail many times. But, instead of foolishly judging, they chose, as Proverbs 17:9 says, to forget each other's mistakes. They wisely showed mercy over and over again.

Today, tomorrow, and the next day, choose to show mercy to the people around you. Living a wise life that's full of mercy will pay great dividends for you in the long run.

- Where do you see evidence of God's mercy in your life?
- In what relationship have you been judgmental instead of merciful? What's one practical way you can offer mercy to that person today?

- Your sins separate you from God. And it is only God's grace that allows you back into a right relationship with him.
