PASTOR'S CORNER - A Country United - a Family United

Hopefully we can and will all echo Joshua's declaration that we are going to serve the Lord. O FOR A THOUSAND TONGUES TO SING

We don't always know what effect we have on those around us. Sometimes a simple act of kindness can make all the difference in somebody else's life. Bedridden with sickness, Charles Wesley was visited by some friends. They met some of his basic needs and shared with him what the Lord had been doing in their lives. At a time when Wesley's faith was faltering, these intentional acts of love were exactly what he needed.

One year after this bout of sickness, Wesley was inspired to write a hymn describing his faith and how it had been strengthened by those who cared for him. In that original writing, the seventh verse contains the words "O for a thousand tongues to sing." It was a paraphrase of a statement by Bishop Peter Bohler, who once said to Wesley, "If I had a thousand tongues, I would praise God with them all."

In Psalm 35, David described the evils that he was facing and included a request for God's intervention. In verse 28, he ended his long prayer with a certainty that, one day, his tongue would tell of the Lord's righteousness and would be filled with the Lord's praise all day long True to his word, David penned many a psalm extolling his God. Like the bishop and Wesley, David would certainly have praised the Lord with a thousand tongues if he had had them.

Lord, You are worthy of my praise. May I never stop speaking of Your goodness and grace toward me.

Sometimes we must accept life on its terms, not our own. Life has a way of unfolding, not as we will, but as it will. And sometimes there is precious little we can do to change things.
